Have You Checked Your Roof Lately?

Wind, rain. Heat, cold. Exposure to weather takes a toll on even the best-built homes, especially your roof. Think about it. Your roof has a big job to do protecting your home and family from the elements, and it can take on quite a lot of wear and tear. Eventually, your roof just wears out. But how do you know when it's time to replace your weather-worn roof or make a repair?

First, how old is it? Age is key in roof replacement. An asphalt shingle roof could last around 15-30 years,

Does Your Wall Color Bring You Down?

yet there are a number of factors that impact how well a roof ages.

Hot summers, harsh winters, wind damage and poor attic ventilation can shorten a lifespan, for example. Shingle quality, shingle color (lighter lasts longer) and roof slope (allowing water to run off) could also have an impact.

Because lifespan varies, it's a good idea to inspect your roof regularly, and fall is a good time to do so. Make sure your roof is in good shape for the months ahead by checking for shingles that are curling, cupping, splitting or even losing granules.

Take note too if any shingles are missing. A shingle that is missing for a while can make other shingles vulnerable to damage, and if you catch a problem early enough, you may be able to avoid premature replacement. If you see signs of damage, check with a qualified roofer. The sooner any potential problems are detected and corrected, the longer your roof lasts.

then add 2 cups of shredded cheese. Stir and heat until the cheese is melted and the soup is hot. You can adjust the amounts of broccoli or cheese to your own preference.

Simple Vegetable Soup – In a large pot, combine a



46-ounce can of tomato-vegetable juice cocktail, a 14.5-ounce can of diced tomatoes with green chili peppers, two drained 15-ounce

cans of mixed vegetables and a 15-ounce can of kidney beans. Then add two potatoes, peeled and cubed, plus vegetables or beef if you prefer. Stir and simmer on medium to low heat for half an hour.
